

The attached chart shows agricultural production within a 2-mile radius of the proposed Roblar Rock Quarry. As you can see there are various local food producers that provide food for our local communities. The adjacent landfill has not been tested to determine the extent of its contents. The applicant himself has requested this twice and has been denied by the county.

Over sixty farmers and ranchers which represent the majority of landowners from Petaluma to Valley Ford have signed the enclosed petition against the Roblar Rock Quarry. By approving the permit for the Roblar rock Quarry without sufficiently testing the landfill you are placing hundreds of millions of agricultural revenues and local food production at risk. Furthermore, in a 2-mile radius from the proposed rock quarry there are over 250 individual employees that rely on these agriculture operations. Please support our local agricultural community and vote no to the Roblar Rock Quarry on October 19, 2010.
